Carmen Black, MD, MHS, is a proud Ethnic Black American woman descended within American history, Deputy Editor of Health Equity for the American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry, adjunct assistant professor of psychiatry at Yale School of Medicine and Morehouse School of Medicine, and as of July 2024, she is the inaugural Vice Chair of Education for the Institute of Living. Dr. Black's educational and publication expertise emphasizes how provider's own racism and bias against persons living with mental illness can harm patients during real-time clinical practice. She is also a national educator in de-policing healthcare, including sponsoring Yale School of Medicine in a grant by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) to remove carceral practices at the Yale-New Haven Hospital. Dr. Black's medical teaching philosophy upholds authentic approaches to physician excellence by openly refusing to "code-switch" in academic and clinical spaces. In these capacities, she has given over 70 featured speaking engagements and nearly 50 publications in the last 3 years alone, as featured in by the American Psychiatric Association, The Lancet Americas, USA Today, The LA Times, The Washington Post, Newsweek, National Public Radio (NPR), and more.
