Patrick Runnels currently serves as the Chief Medical Officer of Population Health for University Hospitals Health Systems in Cleveland, Ohio. Throughout his career, he has served in numerous administrative positions, including Interim Director of the Behavioral Health Institute, Director of Ambulatory Psychiatry and Medical Director for Emergency Psychiatry at University Hospitals, as well as Medical Director for The Centers for Families and Children, a large community mental health center in Cleveland. In all those efforts, he has led the transformation of healthcare systems to focus on value instead of volume, improved access to care for the most complex and vulnerable patients, and focused on developing leadership skills in clinicians of all backgrounds. He has given dozens of invited talks across the country, numerous presentations at national conferences, and has written extensively about transformation and leadership development. Academically, he has appointments as a Professor within the Department of Psychiatry at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and Weatherhead School of Management. He attended medical school at the University of Missouri, Columbia, completing General Psychiatry Residency at Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City, and the Public Psychiatry Fellowship at Columbia University. He also completed his Executive MBA at Case Western Reserve University Weatherhead School of Management. Additionally, he founded the Public and Community Psychiatry Fellowship here at CWRU, serving as its director for 12 years. Recently, he founded the Fellowship in Clinical Leadership and Transformation within the University Hospitals Health System to promote a culture of resonant leadership and equip those serving in leadership roles with the capacity to lead transformational change. He has served in the past on the Board of Trustees for the American Psychiatric Association, The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), Ohio Chapter, and the American Association of Community Psychiatrists. He has also served as chair of the APA Council on Advocacy and Government Relations and The National Council on Behavioral Health Medical Directors Institute.
