

Training the Child and Adolescent Psychiatrist in Forensic Psychiatry

Dr. Raub is Board Certified in both Adult Psychiatry, Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, and Forensic Psychiatry. He graduated from Brandeis University with a Bachelor's in Philosophy, and received his MA in Medical Sciences and MPH in Epidemiology and Biostatistics from Boston University.
