Dr. Olten is a full-time faculty at the outpatient department. He has an expertise in combining both psychotherapy and pharmacotherapy to treat psychiatric disorders. He received trainings at various institutes for psychodynamic psychotherapy, cognitive behavioral therapy and dialectical behavioral therapy. Dr. Olten has special interest in scholarly activities and he has participated as a co-investigator in multiple industry funded trials. His clinical research efforts are primarily focused on psychopharmacology. He has published multiple peer reviewed articles and wrote bipolar disorder chapter in the newest edition of Clinical Manual of Child and Adolescent Psychopharmacology. He made oral presentations at the national and regional conferences. During his training in child and adolescent psychiatry, Dr. Olten was nominated for chief moment officer due to excellence in patient care. Dr. Olten is currently a member of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. He is a graduate of Baskent University School of Medicine in Ankara/Turkey. He completed his adult psychiatry training at Brookdale University Hospital at One Brooklyn Health and child psychiatry training at Children's Hospital of Akron/NEOMED.
