Internship Program Admissions

The IOL pre-doctoral internship is designed to enhance generalist clinical competencies within a scholar-practitioner training philosophy. Our four tracks, which consist of the Adult, Child/Adolescent, Adult Cognitive Behavior and Child Cognitive Behavior Therapy tracks, provide intensive training in assessment and treatment of patients experiencing serious mental illness and complex psychiatric disorders. Child Interns also train for four months in Pediatric Psychology at Connecticut Children's Medical Center. Applicants must be enrolled in an APA-accredited Ph.D. or Psy.D. program in clinical psychology and have completed a minimum of three years of academic and practicum training in clinical psychology. Applicants from doctoral programs in Counseling or School Psychology may be considered if their curriculum and practica closely parallel that of a Clinical Program. Elevation to doctoral candidacy and completion of all academic requirements are necessary. Applicants to the Adult and Child/Adolescent tracks are expected to have had basic coursework and practicum in psychodiagnostic assessment, including projective measures and psychotherapeutic interventions. Applicants to the Cognitive-Behavioral Therapy tracks need not have projective testing experience but familiarity with objective measures of personality and diagnosis is required.

The Internship provides intensive experience providing individual, group and family psychotherapies in inpatient, intensive outpatient, and outpatient settings. Applicants with an interest in and prior experience providing interventions and assessments of patients presenting with serious mental illness are strongly encouraged to apply.

- Applicants must be in good standing in their academic programs and declared ready for internship by their Graduate Director of Training.
- Applicants must have completed all coursework required for their degree program, with the exception of having completed their dissertation.
- Applicants must demonstrate education and training in the core competencies of a Health Service Psychologist sufficient to allow them to assume clinical responsibilities upon the start of internship.
- Familiarity with and basic competencies in the administration, scoring, interpreting, and report writing of standard intellectual, objective, and projective instruments are required for applicants to the non-CBT specialty tracks.
- Education and training in the provision of individual psychotherapy is required. Group and Family psychotherapy training and supervision are strongly desired.
- Total documented practica hours totally at least 500 hours are required.
